## Sailors reunite with loved ones

SAN DIEGO - Approximately 5,000 Sailors and Marines embarked aboard aircraft carrier USS *Theodore Roosevelt* (CVN 71) returned to Naval Air Station North Island Monday after a successful seven-month deployment.

*Theodore Roosevelt* departed San Diego, Oct. 6 and spent the deployment supporting Operations Inherent Resolve and Freedom's Sentinel, as well as maritime security cooperation efforts in 5th and 7th Fleet areas of operations.

The ship transited more than 56,000 miles, and made five port calls in four different countries, to include the United Arab Emirates, the Kingdom of Bahrain, the Republic of Singapore, and the Republic of the Philippines, as well as port calls in Hawaii and Guam.

Led by Rear Adm. Steve Koehler, commander, Carrier Strike Group (CSG) 9, the *Theodore Roosevelt* performed at a high level.

"Over the past seven months, the 6,000 Sailors and Marines of the TR Carrier Strike Group have performed superbly in every mission and in every task that was asked of them. This team has embraced a culture of excellence that comes directly from their routine professional approach to everything they do," said Koehler. "They continue to exceed expectations and set a phenomenal standard for all to emulate. I could not be more proud of them or more honored to serve with them, and it's great to be home with the family and friends that enabled them to serve so well."

*Roosevelt* Sailors and Marines demonstrated more than just mission accomplishment on their deployment. They also gave back to the countries they visited to enhance cooperation and cultural understanding. A total of 383 Sailors and Marines contributed more than 1,200 man hours during 19 community service projects.

"What Rough Riders have accomplished during this deployment was truly inspirational. Earning the privilege to be called the best one day at a time; every Sailor and Marine made what is very difficult look easy," said Capt. Carlos Sardiello, commanding officer *Theodore Roosevelt*. "We are immensely proud of the hard work and dedication that was exhibited as well as the sacrifices of the families. We are looking forward to heartfelt reunions with loved ones, upon our return."

*Theodore Roosevelt* partnered with more than 10 countries including Japan, South Korea, France, India, the Kingdom of Bahrain, and the Republic of Singapore to increase theater security cooperation through various maritime operations.

Approximately 70 aircraft from the squadrons of Carrier Air Wing (CVW) 17 flew 8,319 hours and 1,164 combat sorties and performed counterterrorism operations in Syria, Iraq, and Afghanistan.

*Theodore Roosevelt* also earned the 2017 Battle Efficiency "E" award for West Coast aircraft carriers.

# Face of Defense: Soldier looks toward reunion with canine friend from Iraq

IRBIL, Iraq (May 4, 2018) - Army Reserve Sgt. Tracy McKithern loves dogs.

Last year, when McKithern found a little female white stray dog sniffing around camp here during her yearlong deployment to Iraq -- only one thing was going to happen.

"I fell in love with her immediately," she said.

McKithern, a combat photographer from Tampa, Florida, with the 982nd Combat Camera Company (Airborne), was stationed at the Kurdistan Training Coordination Center, a multinational military organization responsible for the training of peshmerga and Iraqi security forces in and around Irbil, from April 2017 to January 2018.

The little dog and her mother had been wandering around the base for weeks, McKithern found out. Stray dogs are common in Iraq, and the culture is not kind to them. Erby and her mom were kicked and hit with rocks daily and starving. Her brother and sister had disappeared before McKithern arrived.

Despite her rough experiences with humans to that point, Erby ran right up to McKithern the first time she held out her hand to the shaky little pup covered in scratches and dirt.

"She loved everyone," McKithern said of Erby. "She is the sweetest little soul. She came up to me immediately -- probably hungry, but gentle. I think she was looking for love more than anything else."

McKithern, together with soldiers from the Italian and German armies her unit was partnered with, started caring for the little dog. They named her Erby Kasima, after nearby Irbil, the largest city in northern Iraq, and "Kasima" being the Arabic name for beauty and elegance.

The coalition soldiers would go on convoys into the surrounding countryside to train Iraqi army units six days a week, with McKithern documenting the missions. Every time they returned to the base, Erby was waiting.

"She ran up to our convoy every day," McKithern recalled.

"She was so tiny she would fall and trip all over herself to get to us."

It didn't take long for Erby and her mom to realize that, not only were they safe around McKithern and her Italian and German friends, but these humans would feed them, too. As the weeks went by, the dogs' wounds began to heal and they started putting on weight.

Eventually, the growing pup took to sleeping on the step outside McKithern's quarters.

As the end of her deployment approached, McKithern started to wonder how she could ever leave Erby behind when she went back to the states and lamented about it on her Facebook page.

"One night I posted a pic of us on Facebook, with a caption that read something like, 'I wish I could take her home,'" McKithern recalled. "I went to sleep, woke up and my friends and family had posted links to various rescue groups. I reached out to one of them, the nonprofit Puppy Rescue Mission, and they

responded immediately. We sent them \$1,000 and they set up a crowd fund to get the rest. We needed an additional \$3,500."

The immediate outpouring of generosity was astounding, McKithern said.

"We raised the rest of the money very quickly, and most of it was from complete strangers!" she said.

McKithern had many preparations to make before she left Iraq so Erby could eventually follow her. Vaccinations, documentation, travel arrangements -- all had to be done somehow, in a war zone, while she fulfilled her

military duties. It seemed like an overwhelming task in an already overwhelming situation. Even though she now had the funding, McKithern began to lose hope that she'd have the time and energy to complete needed details so Erby could join her in the states.

That's when several Kurdish and German officers that McKithern knew stepped in to help. They offered to complete anything she couldn't get done and get Erby onto the plane. With their help, McKithern returned home and Erby was set to follow her several weeks later.

McKithern had only been home in Florida for about a month when she received orders for a 67-day mission to Fort McCoy, Wisconsin. She was to depart March 11, the very day Erby was scheduled to arrive at John F. Kennedy International Airport in New York City.

"I couldn't believe it!" McKithern said. "But I'm a soldier first, and my commander received an email looking for volunteers." McKithern said the gunnery exercise at Fort McCoy was an important mission and so she deployed to Wisconsin.

However, McKithern's husband, Army Sgt. Wes McKithern, who's also a combat cameraman for the 982nd, met Erby at the airport in New York and drove her home to Tampa,

## Investments focus on more lethal force, Navy secretary says

WASHINGTON - The naval enterprise is investing in its people and capabilities to build a more lethal force in the age of great power competition, Navy Secretary Richard V. Spencer told reporters May 2.

"We're building the Navy the nation needs and the Marine Corps of the future," Spencer said at a Pentagon news briefing with Chief of Naval Operations Adm. John M. Richardson and Marine Corps Commandant Gen. Robert B. Neller.

The naval enterprise is investing in modernization of key capabilities and new technologies to continue to provide warfighters with everything they need to "fight tonight," he said.

"As directed by the 2018 National Defense Strategy, we're building a model of a more lethal, resilient and agile force, capable of deterring and defeating any enemy in this age of, as we know it, renewed power competition," Spencer said.

The enterprise is refining processes, will use every acquisition authority given by Congress to grow the team, and is working in partnership with industry to deliver maximum efficiency and

value to the American taxpayers, he said.

"We're building a more lethal and ready Navy-Marine Corps team by focusing on process

improvement," he added. "We'll ensure that our processes are value-add, and efficiently supporting our warfighter as our core competency."

Further, he underscored the importance of consistent, predictable funding, and welcomed the bipartisan budget agreement signed into law in March by President Donald J. Trump, after years of uncertain funding.

"I will tell you that we will smartly walk out on allocating those resources appropriated by Congress," he said.

Investments in the men and

women who serve are key in the effort to increase the competitive edge over adversaries, Spencer said.

He saluted the service members, including 94,000 sailors and Marines deployed around the globe, ensuring maritime lanes of commerce remain free and open and protecting American citizens and interests abroad.

"Our people are the foundation of everything we do, so we're committed, absolutely committed, to building the strongest foundation possible," he said.

Spencer announced the Navy's newest San Antonio-class amphibious transport dock ship will be named after Medal of Honor recipient Navy Capt. Richard M. McCool Jr.

McCool received the Medal of Honor in 1945 for actions that year during the Battle of Okinawa. He went on to serve in the Korean and Vietnam wars before retiring from naval service. He died in 2008.

"I believe this ship serves as a real testimony and a testament to our commitment of growing

the fleet and our partnership with America," Spencer said. "We definitely look forward to laying keel and getting this ship out onto the high seas."

McCool, a native of Oklahoma, graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1944 and served aboard Landing Craft Support (Large) 122 off the

## U.S. protests Chinese interference with U.S. planes in Djibouti

WASHINGTON - The U.S. has protested to China after repeated instances of lasers interfering with U.S. military aircraft landing in Djibouti, chief Pentagon spokesperson Dana White said May 3.

White confirmed that two Air Force crewmen were slightly injured in one incident.

"They are very serious incidents," White said. "There have been two minor injuries. This activity poses a true ... threat to our airmen."

The United States has formally "demarched" the Chinese government, and requested that the Chinese investigate the incidents. Demarche is a diplomatic term used when a nation protests or objects to policies or actions of another government.

Djibouti - on the Horn of Africa - is a strategic U.S. ally, and the nation has hosted a U.S. presence since 2002. Last year, the country also agreed to host China's first overseas military outpost, and that

coast of Okinawa during World War II.

On June 11, 1945, three kamikaze aircraft attacked McCool's ship, leaving him temporarily unconscious. After regaining consciousness, he began leading others in efforts to save the ship and rescue injured sailors, Navy officials report.

President Harry S. Truman presented McCool the Medal of Honor, the highest U.S. military decoration, Dec. 18, 1945.

The ship, which will be constructed in Mississippi, will be 684 feet long, have a beam length of 105 feet and be capable of operating at speeds in excess of 22 knots.

facility is located near the American base.

Over the last couple of weeks, in at least two and perhaps as many as 10 incidents, U.S. aircraft landing at the base were hit by laser beams. The FAA has issued a Notice to Airmen on the danger, telling aircrews to "use caution for unauthorized laser activity." U.S. officials said the beam is coming from a military grade laser, and that they are confident the Chinese are behind the incidents.

Firing lasers at aircraft can blind aircrew members during critical moments of landing. In the incident where the minor injuries occurred, a C-130 was landing at the base when it was painted by a laser beam. The aircraft managed to land safely, and the two aircrew members are recovering, Pentagon officials said.

"Our concern is the safety of our service members," White said. "We raised the issue with China, and we expect China to investigate it thoroughly."




# CNO establishes of U.S. 2nd Fleet

NORFOLK - CNO, Adm. John Richardson, announced the establishment of U.S. 2nd Fleet during a change of command ceremony for U.S. Fleet Forces Command in Norfolk, May 4.

Second Fleet will exercise operational and administrative authorities over assigned ships, aircraft and landing forces on the East Coast and northern Atlantic Ocean. Additionally, it will plan and conduct maritime, joint and combined operations and will

train, certify and provide maritime forces to respond to global contingencies. Commander, 2nd Fleet will report to USFF.

“Our National Defense Strategy makes clear that we’re back in an era of great power competition as the security environment continues to grow more challenging and complex,” said Richardson. “That’s why today, we’re standing up Second Fleet to address these changes, particularly in the north Atlantic.”

## Coalition, partner forces look to deal final blow to ISIS in Syria

WASHINGTON - Coalition and partner forces are focused on eliminating the remaining Islamic State of Iraq and Syria terrorists in Syria, a top official at Combined Joint Task Force Operation Inherent Resolve said May 8.

“The coalition will relentlessly pursue ISIS wherever they are until they are defeated,” Maj. Gen. Felix Gedney of the British army, the task force’s deputy commander for strategy and support, told Pentagon reporters in a video briefing from Baghdad.

The Syrian Democratic Forces announced May 1 their renewed push to defeat ISIS, he said. The coalition has since conducted 40 strikes against eight ISIS-held buildings, six logistical assets, two explosive factories and two weapons caches, he added.

“This increased defensive action to destroy ISIS marks the beginning of Operation Roundup,” he said. That is the coalition name for the operations “to destroy ISIS in the final areas where they hold ground east of the Euphrates River and liberate the last of their fake caliphate,” he explained.

The global coalition of 71 nations and four international organizations remains “absolutely committed to the defeat of ISIS,” he said.

“As Operation Roundup progresses, the coalition will continue to support the Syrian Democratic Forces, compacting what’s left of ISIS in Syria as we deal the final blow,” he said.

The Syrian Democratic Forces are securing the southeast

portion of the Syria-Iraq border as part of the first phase of Operation Roundup, Gedney said. The SDF, he explained, are eliminating ISIS resistance and establishing defensive positions in coordination with the Iraqi security forces, which are operating in parallel on the Iraqi side of the border.

Meanwhile, coalition forces are supporting the efforts through air, artillery and mortar strikes against ISIS targets, he said.

The general noted that the Iraqi air force struck an ISIS headquarters target May 6 near the Syrian border town of Dashi-sha, further degrading ISIS operational capability throughout eastern Syria and into western Iraq.

The total liberated area in the Euphrates River valley is now more than 5,000 square kilometers, he said, an area of more than 1,900 square miles.

“Ground operations by the Syrian Democratic Forces, coupled with intelligence, surveillance and fire support provided by the coalition, are having a devastating effect on ISIS as we strike ISIS targets and Syrian Democratic Forces continue

to liberate lands held by ISIS terrorists,” the general told reporters.

Continued Successes Against Terrorists

Gedney highlighted other successes against the terrorists, including an April 29 coalition strike in Dashi-sha that killed an Iraqi ISIS financial leader.

Additionally, an April 17 strike near the Syrian town of Hajin resulted in a “severe blow to ISIS and its leadership, killing between 37 and 40 ISIS members, including several senior commanders,” he said.

“We and our partners will continue to pursue ISIS and get them off the battlefield wherever they try to hide within our area of operations,” the general said, underscoring that observations in Syria indicate morale is low among the terrorists and ISIS leaders are fleeing.

This, he said, leaves fighters with “dwindling resources and low morale.”

“ISIS fighters continue to surrender rather than face certain death as the Syrian Democratic Forces tighten their containment lines,” he said

## U.S. Soldiers receive medals from Guatemala’s government

Three U.S. Soldiers have been recognized by the president of Guatemala in Puerto San Jose for their acts of brotherhood and

friendship.

Guatemalan President Jimmy Morales presided over the ceremony at which Staff Sgt. Harcel Rosado, Sgt. 1st Class Michael Kinzie and Chief Warrant Officer 4 Raul Espinoza were awarded the Medal of the White Nun by the Guatemalan armed forces.

The soldiers are members of a technical assistance field team from the Fort Bragg-based Security Assistance Training Management Organization. Assigned to the TAFT in Guatemala, they trained and advised the nation’s elite naval special forces in watercraft and communication tactics in support of their counter-narcotics operations.

waiting patiently to be reunited with her rescuer.

In a few short weeks, McKithern will fly home from Fort McCoy to be with Erby at last. It will be the end of a 16-month journey that’s taken her across

the world to find a little dog in a war zone - and with the help of generous strangers, a nonprofit dog rescue, and soldiers from three different armies - bring her all the way back to become part of a family.

“I can’t believe it,” McKithern said. “It feels like a miracle is happening.”

The Warlocks are responsible for the planning, engineering, installation, coordination and execution of airborne science and technology projects, which is a unique capability. Tofalo, as guest speaker, praised Lewis for his accomplishments by looking to the submarine force’s past. “This week in 1944 U.S. submarines torpedoed or sank 12 enemy vessels, including five warships. Today, we rely on our squadron commodores to instill the same fighting spirit and readiness into our modern undersea warriors,” said Tofalo.

## Social Security Matters

### Ask Rusty - Allocating small business income to husband & wife

Dear Rusty: My wife and I own a small company, so we can allocate our pay as we wish. She had not paid into Social Security in her career so six years ago her pay was increased so she paid more into SS, and me less. My yearly Social Security statement showed I went from about \$3,200 in estimated benefits per month to about \$2,800. We plan to work about another five years, so how should we allocate our pay? And can you recommend a resource for us to get more in depth understanding of how Social Security works? Signed: Small Business Owner



Dear Business Owner: The reason your benefit estimate went down is that when estimates are done before you've reached your full retirement age, they assume that you will continue earning at your most recent level until you reach your FRA. So, when you reduced your annual earnings it also reduced your estimated Social Security benefits. By raising your wife's earnings, she has now been accumulating "quarter credits" - six years of work equals 24 quarter credits for your wife, but she needs 40 to claim benefits on her own work record. The question you should ask yourself is this: Will any benefit your wife gets from her own work record be greater than 1/2 of your benefit at full retirement age? (FRA is 66 + two months for you and 66 + four months for your wife.) Your wife's benefit after she accumulates the 40 credits will presumably be small in comparison to yours. And even if she gets a small benefit on her own record, as your spouse at her full retirement age she'll be entitled to 1/2 of the benefit you were entitled to at your full retirement age (you must be already collecting). Let's use an example:

- If you continue to allocate earnings to your wife for another 4 years she will be eligible for a small "retirement" benefit based upon her own minimum earnings record.
- When you start collecting your own benefit your wife's spousal benefit amount will be 1/2 of yours if she takes it at her FRA (reduced if she takes it sooner).
- Your wife's total benefit (her own and her spousal benefit) will at maximum be 1/2 of yours; so even if she has a small benefit on her own she'll STILL get only up to her spousal benefit amount which will (presumably) be considerably higher than her own.
- If you allocate more/most of your business earnings as payroll to yourself, you will be increasing your own benefit, but you will also be increasing your wife's spousal benefit because she will get 1/2 of whatever your FRA benefit is, regardless of what her own benefit is (unless her own benefit would be more than 1/2 of yours).

Keep in mind that only your earnings up to Social Security's "payroll tax cap" count. That is \$128,400 for this year (changes annually), so you really don't need to allocate any more than that to yourself to improve your own benefit. If your business earnings are more than that you can allocate any excess to your wife, so she can earn more quarter credits because any excess won't be otherwise used to improve your SS benefit. But unless her estimated benefit exceeds half of yours she will still only get 1/2 of yours. While I can't make the decision for you, I hope this gives you enough information to make the right choice on how to allocate your company's earnings as payroll.

## Memorial ceremony honors fallen EOD technicians

EGLIN AIR FORCE BASE, Fla.- Naval School Explosive Ordnance Disposal (NAVSCOLEOD) hosted the 49th Annual Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) Memorial Ceremony at the EOD Memorial May 5.

The EOD community from each of the joint services gathered to honor the memory of 326 heroes, including over 130 since Sept. 11, 2001, and add EOD technicians to the EOD Memorial next to the Kauffman EOD Training Complex here.

"Every year we gather to commemorate all the EOD technicians who have lost their lives while serving our country," said NAVSCOLEOD Commanding Officer Capt. Charles Andrews. "This year we will add 12 names to the wall from warriors who served during World War II, Vietnam and Grenada. While we do not have any EOD technicians who have lost their lives this past year, it is not lost upon us that our job is still inherently dangerous, and we still have many Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, and Marines deployed and serving in many different parts of the world today."

Those added to the memorial this year include:

- Army Cpl. Norman Reynolds, killed in action on Aug. 17, 1944 while serving in World War II.
- Army Pvt. Joseph T. Seredinski, killed in action on Aug. 17, 1944 while serving in World War II.
- Army Cpl. Joseph J. Kozic, killed in action on Oct. 16, 1944 while serving in World War II.
- Army Cpl. Elmer L. Allison, killed in action on Oct. 16, 1944

while serving in World War II.

- Army Capt. Paul B. Bowman, killed on Jan. 31, 1970 while serving in Vietnam.

- Army Capt. Frederick P. Smith, killed on Feb. 13, 1971 while serving in Vietnam.

- Navy Lt. j.g. John T. S. Och, killed on Oct. 25, 1944 while serving in World War II.

- Navy Lt. j.g. George P. McNear III, killed on Jan. 28, 1945 while serving in World War II.

- Navy Lt. Lawrence L. L. Heideman, killed on March 3, 1945 while serving in World War II.

- Navy Lt. j.g. Marvin W. Johnson, killed on April 20, 1945 while serving in World War II.

- Navy Petty Officer 1st Class Stephen L. Morris, killed on Oct. 23, 1983 in Grenada.

- Navy Senior Chief Petty Officer Robert R. Schamberger, killed on Oct. 23, 1983 in Grenada.

Army Lt. Gen. Michael H. Shields, director, Joint Improvised-Threat Defeat Organization (JIDO), served as guest speaker, reflecting on the extraordinary efforts and critical traits of these EOD heroes, the EOD mission, and the immeasurable sacrifice of their families.

NAVSCOLEOD's service detachment commanders and senior enlisted placed a wreath next to their respective service's cenotaph on the EOD Memorial while a fellow service member read the names of their fallen EOD heroes aloud. They concluded with the phrase "We Remember," signifying the very essence and ethos of EOD technicians to never forget the extraordinary efforts of EOD

brothers and sisters who paid the ultimate sacrifice.

The respective service senior general or admiral then presented a flag, previously flown over the EOD Memorial, to each of the families.

Staff members from all four services at NAVSCOLEOD, as well as members of the EOD Warrior Foundation, coordinated and executed comprehensive preparations for the ceremony.

The EOD Memorial Foundation, established in 1969, merged with the Wounded EOD Warrior Foundation in March 2013 to form the EOD Warrior Foundation, which combines the missions and resources of these established organizations to increase the capacity to serve and support the joint service EOD community.

"Today we add 12 new names to the EOD Memorial wall, a memorial that ensures our fallen EOD warriors who have made the ultimate sacrifice will never be forgotten," said Nicole Motsek, EOD Warrior Foundation executive director. "The warriors added today, and the 326 before them, are heroes, and it is an honor and privilege to preserve their legacy on this beautiful memorial, as well

as to provide support to their families."

On April 15, 2014, the Okaloosa County Board of Commissioners officially proclaimed the first Saturday in May as "EOD Day" in honor of the memorial ceremony. The first Saturday of every May represents a sacred time for the EOD community to reflect and remember the heroic actions of fallen EOD Warriors.

The EOD Memorial stands as a monument to the honor, courage and commitment exemplified by EOD technicians from the joint services as they performed the EOD mission.

The EOD badge and its three levels (Basic, Senior, and Master) became the standard for all services in the 1950s. To this day, the EOD badge remains the only badge in the military identical to all branches of the armed forces. This unique distinction reflects the vital role of NAVSCOLEOD in training joint EOD warriors.

NAVSCOLEOD, located on Eglin Air Force Base, Florida, provides high-risk, specialized, basic and advanced EOD training to U.S. and partner nation military and selected U.S. government personnel each year.

## MCPON visits Singapore, emphasizes enlisted leader development and assess quality of life for Sailors and families

The Master Chief Petty Officer of the Navy, MCPON (SG/SW/IW) Steven S. Giordano visited the U.S. military community in Singapore May 3-4.

During his visit, Giordano met with enlisted leadership from Commander, Logistics Group Western Pacific and the Singapore Area Coordinator and with chief petty officers and leading petty officers. In addition to his visit with U.S. Naval personnel, Giordano met with senior enlisted leaders from the Republic of Singapore Navy at Changi Naval Base.

The two-day visit was part of the MCPON's first Southeast Asia tour in which he assessed quality of life issues from Sail-

ors while strengthening his understanding and appreciation for the operational environment in 7th Fleet and the challenges Sailors face. One of Giordano's goals was to convey the importance of shaping the foundation of enlisted leadership. With his recent release of "Laying the Keel - Developing the Backbone of the Navy," Giordano has been emphasizing the importance of enlisted leadership as the backbone of the U.S. Navy. Version 1.0, dated April 2018, outlines the course of enlisted leader development.

"I think there is a great opportunity here in the 7th Fleet area of operations to talk about how we're going to develop our enlisted force as leaders," Giordano said. "Sailors are truly

paying attention to this document, which is something they had direct input into."


Meanwhile, Giordano made a personal approach in soliciting feedback from Sailors about schooling, access to adequate medical care, and family support resources by meeting Sailors in small groups. This method was important for Giordano in helping him gain a clearer picture of quality of life issues in the region. With open ears and a mindset of listening first, Giordano is mindful of what Sailors and their families expect from senior leadership.

"It's a complex area of operation with a lot of moving parts out here and I have a better profound appreciation of what

we ask them to do every day," Giordano said. "I'll take the feedback on board and bring them back to identify what's the right way forward."

As Giordano met with the community, his personal interaction left a significant impression among several Sailors.

"I appreciated the MCPON not having a traditional all-hands call and instead touring our spaces and meeting departments and personnel on a smaller scale, seeing how we work and how our typical work day is laid out," said LN1 (AW) Rebecca Duclayan, staff legalman, Commander, Logistics Group Western Pacific. "It gave us time to actually communicate and get to know one of our bosses on a



more personal level. He was interested in how we worked as a team and how we spent our time off, caring not only about how we were getting the job done, but making sure we were handling our work/life balance well."

Aside from his trip to Singapore, Giordano made stops in Guam, South Korea, and Diego Garcia.

## INTERPERSONAL EDGE: Speaking up at work is all in the delivery

Q: The older I get and the more I see of my workplace, our country and global events, the more I can see what is broken. When I attempt to talk about these issues at work people usually just get upset. I don't want to simply shut up and look the other way as I see too many people doing and saying nothing. Do you have techniques on how to bring up difficult problems without being the messenger that gets shot?

A: Yes, if you become quiet on issues that are important to you, in the long run it is a soul killer. The problem isn't your intentions in speaking but most likely your delivery. The manner in which we express our ideas has everything to do with how our messages are received.

Martin Luther King wisely observed, "Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter." What many powerful leaders do not teach is how we speak up without being sacrificed when others get angry about inconvenient truths.

What really makes people

mad is when you hit the nail on the head of the problem. Now everyone cannot ignore or deny a complicated problem. The bottom line is people are not so much mad at you but upset that once they see a problem they have to work at fixing it. The world is so much easier when we can deny there are problems.

Numerous sociologists, psychologists and even longevity researchers have noted how important it is to our well-being that we engage in meaningful work. The tools for speaking without getting sacrificed are essential to anyone who intends to change the workplace or the world for the better.

Speaking up boldly and without diplomacy is easy. Speaking with tact, not so much. Remember it is not the idea itself but how you communicate the idea.

Some tools that will help you speak up with less conflict:

1) Listen closely to the complaints of others and paraphrase a lot. If you repeat back what others notice and observe, you

are highlighting the problem without becoming the target.

2) Be willing to give away credit for the solution. When you're in a group or with an individual, be willing to say something like, "So it sounds like you've already been thinking a possibility is to increase our budget?" You won't get blowback but people will grab the good idea that they thought of.

3) Avoid lecturing, criticizing or expressing rage. If people feel embarrassed or blamed, they will go after you.

Remember your co-workers are just trying to find out if ignorance can be bliss. Your ability to

diplomatically and gently bring the truth to the forefront can be a market niche that is rare and invaluable.

Q: Everyone I look there are really difficult problems facing me on the job. I feel pretty inadequate most days because I don't have a lot of solutions. Is there a way to face so many problems with so little solutions?

A: Yes, work at cultivating humility and curiosity. Living in the vastness of complicated questions will lead you eventually toward breakthrough solutions that require the crockpot of time and patience.

ready to complete any tasking and any mission in support of 3rd Fleet."

In addition to completing training and exercises, the Sailors and Marines participated in cultural exchanges, and took part in community service projects in Japan at nearly every port the ship visited in the Pacific. The

## Future USS Manchester (LCS 14) transiting to commissioning site

MOBILE, Ala. - The Navy's newest littoral combat ship (LCS), the future *USS Manchester (LCS 14)*, departed from Austal USA here May 5, beginning her journey to her commissioning site in Portsmouth, N.H.

An interchangeable mission package is embarked on each

LCS and provides the primary mission systems in one of these warfare areas. Using an open architecture design, modular weapons, sensor systems and a variety of manned and unmanned vehicles to gain, sustain, and exploit littoral maritime supremacy, LCS provides U.S. joint force access to critical theaters.

"We left our homes in San Diego in August of last year for the shipbuilding yard here in Mobile, so after commissioning we are looking forward to reuniting with our families when we return to our home port this summer."

*Manchester* is the 12th littoral combat ship delivered to the Navy and the seventh LCS of the Independence variant. The Independence variant is noted for its unique hull design, and large flight deck size.

"*Manchester* will be the ninth LCS homeported in San Diego, continuing to advance our nation's desire to grow our Fleet in capability and size to a 355-ship Navy," said Capt. Matthew McGonigle, commander, Littoral Combat Ship Squadron ONE and a native of Turnersville, New



## Experts finalize tactical guidance for platform

SAN DIEGO - Naval Surface and Mine Warfighting Development Center (SMWDC) recently led the Littoral Combat Ship (LCS) Tactical Action Working Group (TAWG) 3.0, marking the completion of the LCS Tactics, Techniques and Procedures (TTP) Manual.

The LCS TAWG was the foundation for the development and refinement of LCS TTP, closing the gaps between existing TTP and the expected LCS missions in support of fleet commanders worldwide.

“The manual is a new approach to TTP development,” said Cmdr. Michael Brasseur, SMWDC Sea Combat Division Plans and Policy branch head. “From the outset, it combined technical and tactical knowledge from across the Navy’s community of experts with the front-line perspective of Sailors who will actually use these tactics at sea. This manual is the one-stop shop for LCS warfighters, and it would not have been possible without the hard work of the TAWG syndicates - teams that paired engineering know-how with tactical expertise under the leadership of LCS waterfront leaders.”

SMWDC led TAWG 3.0 with leadership from all SMWDC divisions and with the support of a range of stakeholders from the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations; Commander, Naval Surface Forces, U.S. Pacific Fleet; the Naval Surface Warfare Center enterprise; Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron (HSC) 3, Helicopter Sea Combat Weapons School Pacific (HSCWSP); LCS Squadrons (LCSRON) 1 and 2; as well as representatives from the technical and naval special warfare communities, and LCS crews. LCS TAWGs convene quarterly. The first TAWG concluded October 2017 in San Diego, and TAWG 2.0 concluded January 2018 in Mayport, Florida.

“Too often, people that don’t know or have never been a part of the LCS program say these ships bring insufficient capability to the maritime fight; that’s just not true,” said Capt. Matthew McGonigle, commodore, Littoral Combat Squadron (COMLCSRON) 1. “In LCS, warfighting is, and always has been, our focus. Today more than ever, we need these platforms, their current/future capabilities, and their adaptability against evolving threats.”

Littoral combat ships have been involved in a range of successful operations and exercises since 2010, including three Indo-Pacific deployments and multiple counter-illicit trafficking operations. There are currently 11 commissioned LCSs, 18 are under construction or in pre-production, and 3 are in the programming phase. By 2030,

LCS and frigates will represent half of the U.S. Navy’s deployed surface combatants, and will be the second largest class of surface ships behind the Arleigh Burke-class destroyer.

“First, let me say that the foundation the anti-submarine warfare team is laying with regards to TTPs will pay huge dividends for all future LCS,” said Cmdr. Jose Roman, commanding officer, USS *Freedom* (LCS 1). “By defining our theoretical limits, we enable the LCS Fleet to quickly adapt to meet new threats and missions, while simultaneously achieving and maintaining high standards.”

The LCS TTP Manual was designed to arm warfighters by expertly balancing the highly technical aspects of these ships, with readability and understandability that supports prompt and effective actions by minimally-manned crews. This provides the flexibility these optimally manned ships demand. The contents were created and will be continually refined by LCS subject matter experts. The doctrine is grounded in on-hull experience, and maximizes LCS’s tactical flexibility and innovation within independent and/or multi-ship operations in both littoral and open-ocean environments.

## NAVFAC Southwest hosts Industry Forum this week

SAN DIEGO - Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC) Southwest hosted an Industry Forum May 9 at Balboa Park.

The forum gave contractors an opportunity to meet one-on-one with their direct contract and technical counterparts at NAVFAC Southwest to discuss their capabilities and abilities to assist NAVFAC Southwest with fulfilling its mission objectives and support the warfighters.

“The purpose of the Industry Forum is to have open dialog between the government and industry to obtain capability information from prospective future contractors and to learn of innovative ideas prevailing in industry,” said Lora E. Morrow, NAVFAC Southwest Office of Small Business Programs deputy. “Although no contracts will result from the Industry Forum directly, NAVFAC anticipates there may be future procurements that use the innovations discussed at the forum.”

More than 150 individuals attended the event. They paired with their NAVFAC Southwest counterparts for matchmaking sessions. Most of the registrants were from small business firms seeking to work with NAVFAC.

“NAVFAC Southwest is seeking input from industry regarding commercial trends and practices that may be useful in future procurements,” said Morrow. “Many NAVFAC personnel will use the information obtained at the forum as a stepping stone in their market research efforts on upcoming requirements. The forum is also a tremendous means by which firms that have not yet worked with NAVFAC Southwest can introduce themselves and the benefits they offer to the government.”

NAVFAC Southwest Commanding Officer Capt. Mark Edelson, spoke at the start of the forum. NAVFAC Operations Officer Capt. Dan Cook gave an overview of NAVFAC Southwest’s workload forecast.

# SPAWAR joins regional leaders to discuss combating cybersecurity vulnerabilities

SAN DIEGO - Rear Adm. Christian Becker, Space and Naval Warfare Systems Command (SPAWAR) commander, participated in a cybersecurity panel as a part of the San Diego University Club's distinguished speakers series May 4.

Joined by high ranking cyber professionals from industry, academia and government, Becker and his fellow panelists discussed the convergence of factors that has led San Diego to become a cybersecurity hub, with a significant impact on the

regional economy. According to the Cyber Center of Excellence, S.D. is home to 7,600 cyber jobs that generate \$1.9 billion in economic impact and these numbers will only continue to grow.

During the event, attendees gained insight directly from those who design, develop and deploy advanced cybersecurity technologies throughout the city, state, nation and world. In addition to Becker, some of the brightest minds in cyber served as panelists to represent prominent organizations throughout San Diego that significantly

influence the city's economy and cybersecurity environment, including FBI Supervisory Special Agent John Caruthers and UC-San Diego cybersecurity expert Dr. Stefan Savage.

Senior security consultant for Kryptos Logic, Paul Bergman, moderated the panel, kicking off the event with asking Becker how SPAWAR remains at the forefront of cybersecurity.

"We rely on the great talent of our people, so that we can protect and defend our nation," said Becker. "We employ nearly half of the cyber professionals in the greater San Diego area. Remaining on the cutting edge is about attracting, obtaining and maintaining talent."

In today's ever evolving technological environment, Savage said it's both about attracting talent and continually educating employees.

"It's imperative for cybersecurity professionals to be doing continuous learning from day one," said Savage. "It's not an

area where you can train up a fixed set of skills and expect professionals to be ready to perform. They must be trained with the ability to be agile and acquire new skills on the job."

With a mission to remain ahead of threats through leadership, agility, and integration, cybersecurity is a key concern for the FBI.

"We have a top ten priority list," said Caruthers. "The first is to protect the U.S. from terrorist attacks, the second is to protect the U.S. against foreign intelligence operations and espionage, and the third is to protect the U.S. against cyber-based attacks and high-technology crimes."

The combination of the need to stay ahead of evolving cyber threats and the increasing need for cybersecurity professionals, has generated a great amount of interest in San Diego, making the region a hot spot for both innovation and investment. - *To read the complete story, see [http://www.navy.mil/submit/display.asp?story\\_id=105490](http://www.navy.mil/submit/display.asp?story_id=105490).*

# Eleven new Anti-Submarine Surface Warfare Tactics Instructors join the Fleet

SAN DIEGO - Rear Adm. Yvette M. Davids, Senior Military Advisor to the Assistant Secretary of State for Political-Military Affairs, welcomed the 11 newly qualified Warfare Tactics Instructors (WTIs) to the Fleet onboard Naval Base San Diego, May 3.

The event was a sign of the growing capacity and capability WTIs provide to the Surface Fleet, and reflective of the Fleet's demand signal for capable and confident junior officers who are trained in advanced tactics. Graduates of one of Naval Surface and Mine Warfighting Development Center's (SMWDC) three WTI courses of instruction - Anti-Submarine Warfare/ Surface Warfare (ASW/SUW), Integrated Air and Missile Defense (IAMD), and Amphibious Warfare (AMW) - qualify to wear distinctive WTI patches on their uniforms.

"I am honored to be here with you today as you mark a significant milestone in your personal professional development," said Davids, a career surface warfare officer. "But as you know, today isn't a finish line, but rather a starting block for you to sprint out from as you begin to do important work our Navy, and the nation, needs to have done. I challenge you to learn faster than our adversaries. You must maintain the WTI ethos, stay humble, and take joy and pride in the success of those you mentor and teach."

The WTIs completed 14 weeks of rigorous classroom instruction focused on application of the Navy's most innovative tactics and technolo-

gies. The curriculum was designed to develop WTIs who are part Warrior, Thinker and Teacher. WTI training includes emphasis on tactical simulations, immersion in Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures (TTPs) and instructor skills. The ASW/SUW WTI curriculum is a collaborative effort led by SMWDC's Sea Combat Division and subject matter experts who traveled from multiple commands including Naval Aviation Warfighting Development Center, the Office of Naval Intelligence and the Naval Undersea Warfare Center.

"This was a great cohort of WTI candidates, and I'm excited to see what they will do in their readiness production tours and beyond," said Capt. Dwayne "Duke" Ducommon, director SMWDC Sea Combat division director. "Each day I see the important work that our WTIs do throughout the Fleet, and the steady, important cultural changes that they are enabling. They represent a bright future for the Surface Warfare community."

Upon graduation, the majority of newly patched WTIs will begin readiness production tours where they will provide advanced tactical training, develop doctrine and tactics, techniques and procedures (TTP), conduct capabilities assessments, analysis and requirements, or provide operational support to the Fleet in billets around the Navy that leverage their unique skill sets. Depending on timing, other graduates receive immediate assignments aboard ships and afloat staffs, including one who completed the course between his first and second division officer tours.

"I am excited to return to the fleet this sum-

mer as an ASW/SUW WTI to help develop the tactical proficiency of USS *Porter* (DDG 78) Sailors and throughout the Rota waterfront," said Lt. j.g. Matthew Heimer, *Porter's* Anti-Submarine Warfare Officer and recipient of the Arleigh Burke award from the class.

"I'm humbled that my command recommended and supported me through this program and I want to give back and make

a difference during our upcoming Forward Deployed Naval Forces patrols and exercises. I hope to have a lasting impact and empower sailors with the confidence, competence, and tactical tools they need to succeed in any contested environment."

To date, over 230 qualified WTIs have joined the ranks of junior officers steeped in tactical training and expertise, providing an enabling force for command-

ers throughout the Fleet.

"I like to think that when I tap into the support of one WTI, I'm getting the support of 233 of the top tacticians in the Fleet," said Davids.

SMWDC is a subordinate command of Commander, Naval Surface Forces, Pacific Fleet and exists to increase the lethality and tactical proficiency of the Surface Force across all domains.



# AutoMatters & More: Celebrating Cinco de Mayo at a Car Show with Lowriders & at Balboa Park

What is Cinco de Mayo?

Cinco de Mayo celebrates the May 5, 1862 victory by Mexico over France in the Battle of Puebla, fought during the Franco-Mexican War. It is not a celebration of Mexico's Independence Day. Rather, especially just north of the Mexican border in San Diego, it has evolved into a popular celebration of Mexican culture and heritage among Mexican-Americans (see [www.history.com/topics/holidays/cinco-de-mayo](http://www.history.com/topics/holidays/cinco-de-mayo)).

Cinco de Mayo Con Orgullo Festival & Impalas Car Club Classic Car Show

“Con orgullo” means “with pride” in Spanish. That is appropriate, given that the owners of the cars in the car show take great pride in their vehicles.

The show was held on Saturday, May 5th in San Diego's Chicano Park. Located at the foot of the iconic Coronado Bridge, Chicano Park has long been a popular gathering place for members of San Diego's Mexican-American community. Born out of protest, this National Historical Landmark is recognized for its many cultural and historical murals painted on the concrete support structures for the Coronado Bridge's ramps (see [https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Chicano\\_Park](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Chicano_Park) and <http://chicano-park.com/cpmap.html>).

The cars – many of them beautiful lowriders with their characteristically small white-wall tires mounted on knock-off wire wheels, held on by a central spinner instead of by several lug nuts – were displayed on and beside the roadways on either side of the park. Many of these were highly customized, extremely lowered vehicles with their remotely-controlled ride height independently adjustable at each of the four corners of the vehicle. Other modifications included spectacular, multi-colored paint jobs, chromed engine parts; tufted, brightly colored upholstery; and intricately engraved chrome mirrors and trim.

Favorite cars for the conversion to lowriders are Lincolns, Cadillacs, Monte Carlos and other large American cars, but other vehicles get the lowrider treatment too. They are immediately recognizable by how low they are to the ground, and how they rise up on command. Each of the four corners of these vehicles can be lifted independently, either by hydraulics or air. A small percentage of vehicles so-equipped compete with each other by “hopping,” where the vehicles literally jump up and down: front first, rear first, all four tires off the ground at once, and even to the point of standing up on the rear bumper (do a Google search for hopping lowriders). This extreme, violent movement is very hard on a car. Parts large and small can and do go flying off.

In front of Chicano Park's show stage, people danced to the musical stylings of “Rumba y Soul.” Odalys Dominguez's rendition – sung in Spanish – of “Cu Cu Rru Cu Cu Paloma” was absolutely out of this world (listen to it sung by Trini Lopez on YouTube). Mr. G Entertainment sponsored the Kids' Zone and


gave out stuffed animals.

Balboa Park Cinco de Mayo Celebration

Horsepower of a different kind was featured at the First Annual Cinco de Mayo celebration in Balboa Park (<https://balboaparkconservancy.org/project/cinco-de-mayo-concert/>). A parade, featuring four riders on horseback from the Escaramuza Charra las Golondrinas, led the way to where a full slate of free, Mexican-themed entertainment was presented in the Plaza de Panama.

Food trucks on the El Prado walkway offered a wide variety of cuisines.

cluded rope tricks (some performed on horseback!); ballet folklórico; a narrated fashion showcase of traditional Mexican regional clothing; strolling Mariachis; danceable salsa, merengue and cumbia music; traditional Wa-Kushmá folk dancing; and,

at day's end, the San Diego State University Marching Aztecs drumline and a Cinco de Mayo concert in the famous Spreckels Organ Pavilion.

Occupying one of the many booths in the Plaza de Panama,

The Balboa Park Conservancy provided Mexican-themed coloring sheets, and Lucha Libre and Frida Kahlo mask-making.

Among the beautiful, traditional art pieces for sale were ‘Day of the Dead’ catrinas from

San Diego's Balgonte Galeria.

In advance of the San Diego County Fair (running selected dates from June 1 to July 4 – see [sdfair.com](http://sdfair.com)) were booths featuring a few of the hand-made crafts from Mexico that will be available, along with entertainment, in the Fair's Fiesta Village.

Other booths included the Centro Cultural de la Raza, City Heights Music School, the Mexican Consulate, park museums and the park's House of Mexico international cottage.



### MY PET WORLD

### Build trust with cats through play and slow blinking

Dear Cathy,

I have a 7-year-old cat named Squeaky. She was fixed as a kitten and is an indoor cat. She was the only cat for two years before we inherited a second kitty from my son. The second cat really brought Squeaky out of her shell. Both cats get along fine, but Squeaky is not friendly with other people. One of my sons moved back home and cannot get close to her. He loves animals and has tried to befriend her, but she won't have anything to do with him. She is not a lap cat at all. She will sit somewhat close to him but does not want him to touch or pet her. She is like this with everyone. My son has been her for a year and a half and nothing has changed.

When I take her to the vet, she hisses and growls at whoever tries to get near her. She is very untrustworthy of everyone. Is there some kind of medication I can give her to become less hostile toward my son and other people? When I take her out of the house to the vet, it is like she needs a tranquilizer to calm her

nerves. I realize each animal has their own personality, but hers is extreme with everyone except me. - Carol, Aurora, IL

Dear Carol,

You can talk to your veterinarian about anxiety medication for vet visits, but I wouldn't worry about trying to make her a people pleaser there. Most cats are not excited about going to the vet's office and no amount of medication will make her "happy" to go.

As for the home, there are a few things your son can do to help Squeaky relax in his presence. One way is through interactive play. Just like how a step-dad might build trust with his new son or daughter by playing catch, animals relax and learn to trust people who play with them.

Have your son get a fishing pole-like toy or a feather toy that he can use to entice her when she comes into the room. At first, she will be interested in the toy, but won't approach. That's OK. Let her watch. Do this for a few minutes a few times a day. Over time, she won't be able to resist and should pounce and play with the toy.

In the feline world closing one's eyes and blinking slowly around another cat or human also is a sign of trust. Throughout the day, tell your son to look (never stare) at Squeaky and do an exaggerated slow blink. You will know she is relaxing when she slowly blinks back.

Finally, tell him to never reach out to Squeaky. With cats, it's best to let them come to you for affection.
